Safeguarding

We are always keen to work in partnership with you and if you have any concerns at all about the safety or wellbeing of a child please contact a member of our safeguarding team.

From a health and safety point of view as well as from safeguarding please may I politely remind you to only use the designated paths for entry and exit from school and to not use the car park for access. Please also take care when moving around the building as there are large numbers of people moving at once and we wish to reduce the risks of accidents. May I also remind you not to park on the yellow lines outside school and to be mindful of the children walking on the pavements. There have been some near misses and it is essential that we remain vigilant about safety on the roads.

Attendance

We were thrilled with how great our attendance was last term and we are starting to see the impact it is making on the progress of our pupils. Please do keep this up so that we can achieve 96% for the next half term. I know that this is the time of year when there are lots of bugs and viruses going round so please encourage your children, as we will do, to keep washing their hands and using tissues to stay as healthy as they can. If your child has a cold or a sniffle, please still send them into school with some appropriate medicine so that they are able to keep accessing their learning.

This week attendance for the whole school was 96.1%, well done Year 2 who were this weeks attendance winners with 99.1%.

Uniform

School uniform consists of a school jumper or cardigan, light blue shirt, grey/black trousers or skirt/pinafore, a tie, grey or black socks/tights, and black shoes. For PE days children will need a PE kit. The PE kit is a plain white tee shirt, blue shorts and black pumps. Please make sure that all items of uniform including PE kit are labelled clearly with your child's name. Don't forget that Magic Monday's children are allowed to be in their PE kit all day. We will be working outside on Forest Schools this half term on a Monday so please make sure that your child has a coat with them.

After School Clubs

This term we have on offer: Dance and Gym, Ukulele, Choir, Football Club, Bonnies Rangers and Christmas Craft Club. Please check on Parent pay for more details. Clubs will change every half term so that we are able to ensure that we are meeting the needs of every child. From next half term to help cover the cost of the resources we will need to charge £1 per child per club. This will help us keep the after school extracurricular provision improving.

Please note that there is no charge for the Sacramental Programme group, Booster group or the Wellbeing club as these are funded via a different means.



Booster Groups

We are running after school booster groups for pupils in Year 6 who would benefit from an extra focused session working on Maths or English. If your child is invited to attend these sessions please support them in doing so.

Sacramental Programme

The preparation for this starts next week on 5th November from 3.15-4pm with myself and Mrs Moran. Please let us know if your child wishes to make their first Holy Communion this year. If you wish to have your child make their first Holy Communion but they are to yet baptised, please contact me as soon as possible.
